Transfer Patterns Study, Fall 2003 Report

The Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer (ACAT) is pleased to present the results of its Transfer Patterns Study, Fall 2003. The tables in the study are based on reports from the post-secondary institutions as requested by ACAT. Starting in Fall 1979 and continuing each year, ACAT has collected data from institutional Contact Persons for its study of transfer patterns. These data now provide information over two decades regarding the volume of student transfer between and among post-secondary institutions in Alberta and from out-of-province post-secondary institutions. The study draws on reports from 31 participating institutions including 4 universities, 15 public colleges, 2 technical institutes, 6 private colleges with accredited degree programs, and 4 private colleges. Blue Quills First Nations College and Yellowhead Tribal College did not report for Fall 2003. Prairie Bible College reported for the first time in Fall 2003.

The attached Mobility Tables record the number of students admitted for the first time to their post-secondary institution during the Fall 2003 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. The tables indicate the last post-secondary institution attended as the sending institution. Universities and private colleges with accredited degree programs are to include admissions to post-diploma degree programs and to exclude admissions to Graduate Studies and after degree programs. The Mobility Tables do not attempt to indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience. To provide perspective, ACAT also produces the "Transfer Patterns Studies, 1979-2003: Extracts by Sector" document, the tables of which have been extracted from the Mobility Tables of each annual Transfer Patterns Study.

Alberta College operated as a private college until August 2000 when it was taken over by the province of Alberta. Effective July 2002, most of its programs were assumed by Grant MacEwan College and offered at its Alberta College Campus. Transfer from Alberta College is reported in the 'Other' sector for this report.

Beginning with 2000 data for Athabasca University, a procedural change at the University has meant that comparability with previous years' data cannot be made. Athabasca University's procedures are attuned to its unique role, which typically enables students to begin a program at any time during the year. Most AU program students will not be applying for credit transfer until they have completed six credits toward their degree and as a result there will be significant under-reporting of transfer activity at AU for the Transfer Patterns Study. Given these caveats, the reported results should be viewed as estimates rather than precise counts.

The following are highlights for Fall 2003:

Mobility Tables: Within Province Transfer

1. 9,827 students were admitted who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. The total represents a 6.0% increase over the previous year. More students transferred into universities, private colleges with accredited degree programs, private colleges and technical institutes than last year. Fewer students transferred into public colleges.
2. 4,953 students with prior post-secondary experience were admitted to universities. This is 50.4% of the province-wide total number of students admitted who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. The total is down 1.2% from the record of 5,011 set in 2000, but is up by 3.2% since last year.
3. Transfers to universities from the seven public colleges with University Transfer programs increased by 109 (3.4%) for a total of 3,310 students. In 2003, University Transfer programs were offered by Grande Prairie Regional College, Grant MacEwan College, Keyano College, Lakeland College, Medicine Hat College, Mount Royal College, and Red Deer College. Record numbers of students transferred to universities in 2003 from Grant MacEwan and Mount Royal.
4. Transfers to public colleges from other Alberta post-secondary institutions decreased by 172 (5.3%) in 2003 for a total of 3,076 students.
5. Transfers to technical institutes from other Alberta post-secondary institutions increased by 409 (46.4%) in 2003 for a total of 1290 students.
6. Transfers to private colleges with accredited degree programs from other Alberta post-secondary institutions increased by 147 (48.5%) in 2003 for a total of 450 students.
7. Transfers to private colleges from other Alberta post-secondary institutions increased by 19 (50.0%) in 2003 for a total of 58 students. Blue Quills First Nations College and Yellowhead Tribal College did not report in 2003, but Prairie Bible College did report for the first time.
8. In 2003, colleges and technical institutes admitted 4,424 students with prior post-secondary experience, which is 45.0% of the total number of students who transferred within Alberta. Universities and private colleges with accredited degree programs admitted 5,403 students, which is 55.0% of the total number of students who transferred within Alberta.

Summary of Within Province Transfer: 1979 to 2003

9. From 1979 to 2003, a total of 97,183 students transferred to universities.
10. From 1979 to 2003, a total of 48,267 students from the seven public colleges with University Transfer programs transferred to universities.
11. From 1979 to 2003 a total of 45,887 students transferred to public colleges.
12. From 1979 to 2003, a total of 32,400 students transferred to technical institutes.

13. From 1979 to 2003, the mobility tables record a total of 185,554 students who were admitted to participating post-secondary institutions with prior post-secondary experience.

Mobility Tables: Into Province Transfer

14. Transfers into the province in Fall 2003 numbered 4,071 students, a decrease of 274 or 6.3% over the previous year's total. Into-province transfers constitute 29.3% while transfers within the province constitute 70.7% of the combined total of 13,898 students who transferred in Fall 2003. In Fall 2002, into-province transfers constituted 31.9%, while transfers within the province constituted 68.1% of total transfers that year.
15. In 1979, 2,993 students transferred into the province. Into-province transfers constituted 49.2% of the combined total in 1979.

Mobility Tables

The following tables provide information about the volume and direction of post-secondary transfer traffic and are helpful to Council in determining its ongoing priorities. Annually since 1979 Council has been collecting information from each post-secondary institution about the number of students with prior post-secondary experience who move to another post-secondary institution. Each post-secondary institution was asked to record the number of students admitted for the first time to their institution during the Fall 2003 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. Summary data by sector are presented on the following tables.

NOTE: These data do not indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience.

As well, the data do not indicate whether the prior post-secondary studies were used for admission to a program at the receiving institution.

As admission records vary among the diverse institutions reporting on the following tables, strict comparability may be difficult.

Furthermore, the reported totals may not fully reflect mobility as some admissions categories may be incompletely reported; for example, part-time students at non-university public institutions, visiting students, unclassified students, and students who are enrolled at two institutions at the same time.

As Athabasca University offers continuous admission, students often proceed one course at a time through completion of their program and so the distinction between "full-time" and "part-time" may not be appropriate. AU distinguished between "full-time" and "part-time" in its reports for 1993-1996. Since then, AU's entry has been displayed as "part-time" although it includes an undetermined, though probably small, number of "full-time" students. Because of its continuous admission policy, the Fall 2003 admission cycle is defined as the number of new students admitted to Athabasca University between 1 January 2003 through 30 September 2003. Prior to 1999, AU's reporting period covered the five month period from 1 May through 30 September.
