Transfer Patterns Study, Fall 2006 Report

The Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer (ACAT) is pleased to present the results of its Transfer Patterns Study, Fall 2006. The tables in the study are based on reports from the post-secondary institutions as requested by ACAT. Starting in Fall 1979 and continuing each year, ACAT has collected data from institutional Contact Persons for its study of transfer patterns. These data now provide information over two and one-half decades regarding the volume of student transfer between and among post-secondary institutions in Alberta and from out-of-province post-secondary institutions. The 2006 study draws on reports from 25 participating institutions including 4 universities, 11 public colleges, 2 technical institutes, 6 private colleges with accredited degree programs and 2 private colleges. Since its merger with the University of Alberta (U of A) in 2004, Augustana Faculty (formerly Augustana University College) numbers are reported under the UofA. Blue Quills First Nations College, Maskwachees Cultural College, and Yellowhead Tribal College did not report for Fall 2006. Taylor University College & Seminary, Lakeland College, Keyano College, and DeVry Calgary also did not report for Fall 2006.

The attached Mobility Tables record the number of students admitted for the first time to their post-secondary institution during Fall 2006 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. The tables indicate the last post-secondary institution attended as the sending institution. Universities and private colleges with accredited degree programs were asked to include admissions to post-diploma degree programs and to exclude admissions to Graduate Studies and after degree programs. The Mobility Tables do not attempt to indicate whether students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience. To provide perspective, ACAT also produces the "Transfer Patterns Studies, 1990-2006: Extracts by Sector" document, the tables of which have been extracted from the Mobility Tables of each annual Transfer Patterns Study.

It should be noted that Athabasca University's (AU) procedures are attuned to its unique role, which typically enables students to begin a program at any time during the year. Most AU program students will not be applying for credit transfer until they have completed six credits toward their degree and as a result there will be significant under-reporting of transfer activity at AU in the Transfer Patterns Study. Given this caveat, the reported results should be viewed as estimates rather than precise counts.

The following are highlights for Fall 2006:

Mobility Tables: Within Province Transfer

1. 9,534 students were admitted to a post-secondary institution who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. The total represents a 3.0% decrease over the previous year. More students transferred into universities than last year. Fewer students transferred into public colleges, technical institutes, private colleges and private colleges with accredited degree programs.
2. 5,603 students with prior post-secondary experience were admitted to universities. This is 58.8% of the province-wide total number of students admitted who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. 2005 results indicated 5,309 transfers to universities, beating the old record of 5,011 set in 2000. The current results (2006) once again set a new record, which is up 5.5% from last year.
3. Transfers to universities from the public colleges with University Transfer programs increased by 150 students (4.1%) for a total of 3,852 students. University Transfer programs are offered by Grande Prairie Regional College, Grant MacEwan College, Keyano College, Lakeland College, Medicine Hat College, Mount Royal College, Red Deer College, Portage College and Northern Lakes College.
4. Transfers to public colleges from other Alberta post-secondary institutions decreased by 266 students (9.0%) in 2006 for a total of 2,704 students. The all-time high was in 2002 when public colleges received 3,248 transfer students.
5. Transfers to technical institutes from other Alberta post-secondary institutions decreased by 191 students (17.0%) in 2006 for a total of 930 students.
6. Transfers to private colleges with accredited degree programs from other Alberta post-secondary institutions decreased by 124 students (30.7%) in 2006 for a total of 280 students.
7. Transfers to private colleges from other Alberta post-secondary institutions decreased by 6 students (26.1%) in 2006 for a total of 17 students. Blue Quills First Nations College, Maskwachees Cultural College and Yellowhead Tribal College did not report in 2006.
8. In 2006, colleges and technical institutes admitted 3,651 students with prior post-secondary experience, which is 38.3% of the total number of students who transferred within Alberta. Universities and private colleges with accredited degree programs admitted 5,883 students, which is 61.7% of the total number of students who transferred within Alberta.

Summary of Within Province Transfers: 1979 to 2006

9. From 1979 to 2006, the mobility tables record a total of 214,780 students who were admitted to participating post-secondary institutions with prior post-secondary experience.
10. From 1979 to 2006 a total of 113,000 students transferred from universities.
11. From 1979 to 2006 a total of 59,160 students from the nine public colleges with University Transfer Programs transferred to universities.
12. From 1979 to 2006 a total of 54,738 students transferred to public colleges.
13. From 1979 to 2006 a total of 35,727 students transferred to technical institutes.

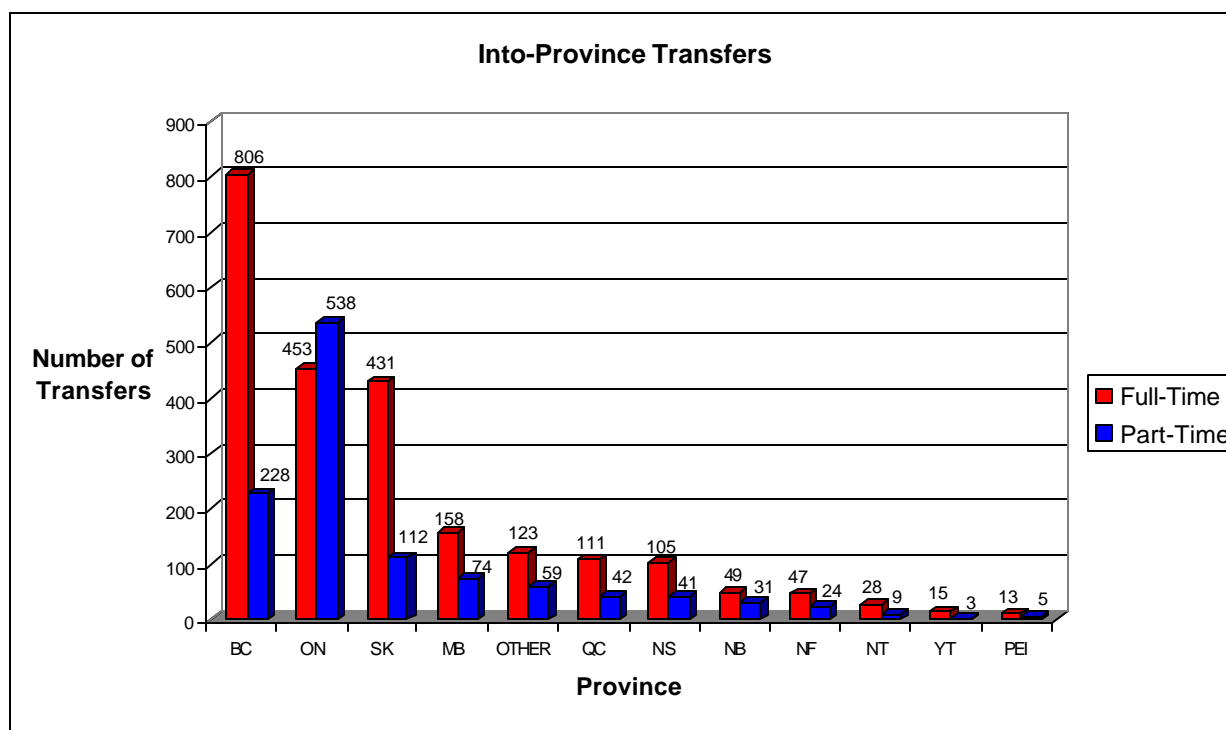

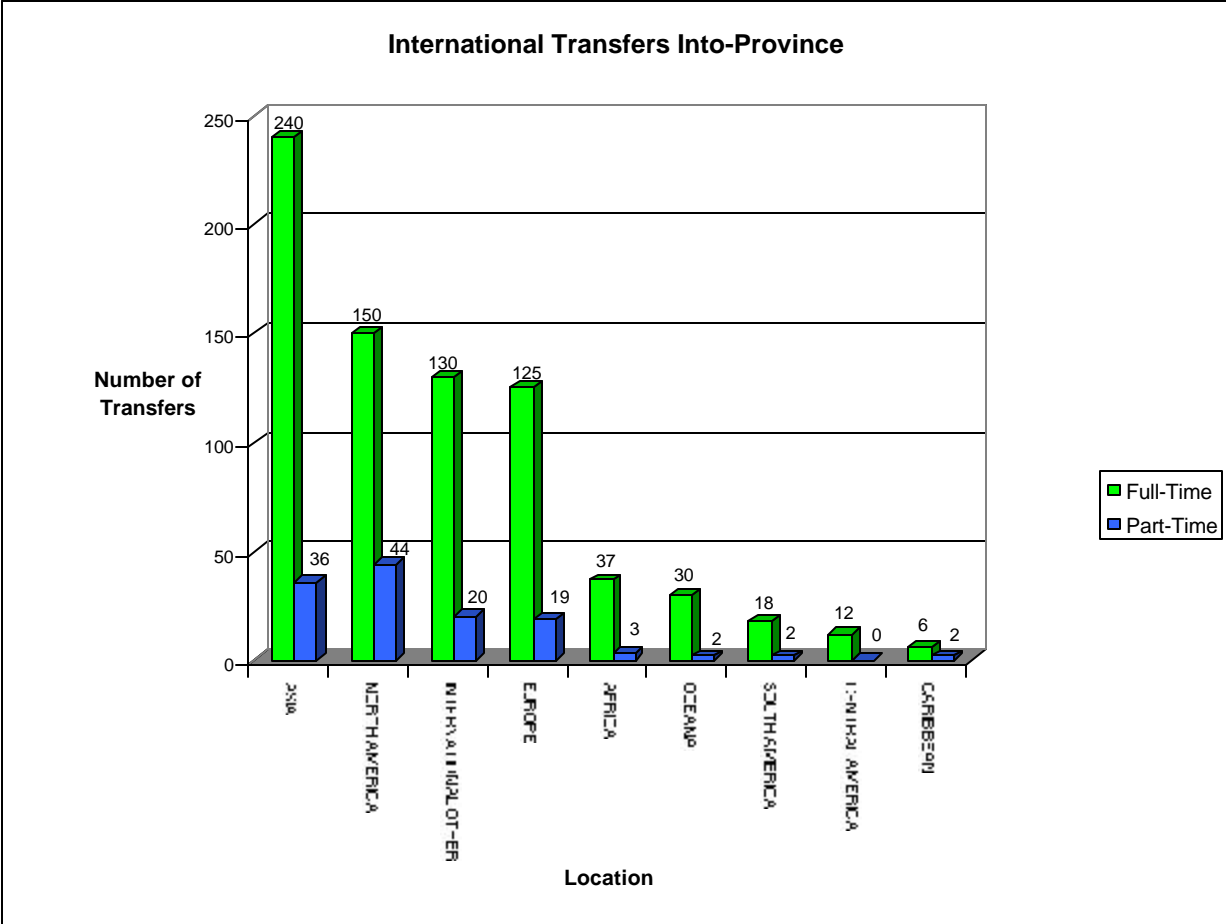
Mobility Tables: Into Province Transfer

14. Transfers into the province in Fall 2006 numbered 4,172 students (including students from other countries), an increase of 172 or 4.3% over the previous year's total, with decreases to all sectors, except to universities where 233 more students were reported and to public colleges where 22 more students were reported (see chart below).
15. Into-province transfers constitute 30.4%, while transfers within the province constitute 69.6% of the combined total of 13,706 students who transferred in Fall 2006. Comparatively, in Fall 2005, into-province transfers constituted 28.9%, while transfers within the province constituted 71.1% of the total transfers that year.
16. In 1979, 2,993 students transferred into the province. Into-province transfers constituted 49.2% of the combined total in 1979.



17. The top five provinces for full-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2006 were respectively British Columbia with 34.4% (806) of students, Ontario with 19.4% (453) of students, Saskatchewan with 18.4% (431) of students, Manitoba with 6.8% (158), and Quebec with 4.7% (111) of students. The category marked "other" indicates 5.3% (123) of full-time student transfers. This is a result of how post-secondary institutions reported transfer students. There is a significant difference from Fall 2005 and Fall 2006 with respect to the "other" category; 2005 reported 8 full-time "other" students, compared to 123 for 2006.

18. The top five provinces for part-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2006 were respectively Ontario with 50.5% of the students, British Columbia with 21.4% of the students, Saskatchewan with 18.4% of the students, Manitoba with 6.9% of the students, and Nova Scotia with 4.5% of the students. The category marked “other” numerically ranks in position 5 with part-time students totalling 5.5%. However, there is a significant difference in the reporting of the part-time students from Fall 2005 to Fall 2006. In 2005 there were 825 reported part-time students in the “other” category; compared to 2006 numbers of 59 students. This is explained by an improvement in the reporting of the into province transfer students.



19. Irrespective of the “International other” category, the highest origin for international transfers into-province is from Asia with 240 (32.1%) of the full-time students and 36 (28.1%) part-time students, followed by North America 150 (20.1%) full-time students, and 44 (34.4%) part-time students. Europe was the next highest with 125 (16.7%) full-time students, and 19 (14.8%) part-time students, and Africa was ranked fifth in international transfers with 37 (4.9%) full-time students, and 3 (2.3%) part-time students. It is difficult to make any comparisons between this data and the data reported for Fall 2005 due to the disproportionate reporting as “Other/unknown” in 2005. It will be interesting to compare information collected in the coming years to map any emerging trends.

20. Although the “International other” category is significant, it pales in comparison to the Fall 2005 numbers. 2005 reported 374 full-time students and 83 part-time students in this category. For the 2006 report, post-secondary institutions were encouraged to more accurately report their transfer students and to clearly indicate where they all came from. The “International other” category was only to be used if no information could be obtained. Therefore, we have a more accurate picture of the international transfers into the province.

To help track trends in student access, applications, admissions, mobility and transfer, ACAT continues to conduct applied research as part of its mandate on matters related to transfer of students among Alberta's post-secondary institutions.

Mobility Tables – All Data

The following tables provide information about the volume and direction of post-secondary transfer traffic and are helpful to Council in determining its ongoing priorities. Annually since 1979 Council has been collecting information from each post-secondary institution about the number of students with prior post-secondary experience who move to another post-secondary institution. Each post-secondary institution was asked to record the number of students admitted for the first time to their institution during the Fall 2006 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. Summary data by sector are presented on the following tables.

NOTE: These data do not indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience.

As well, the data do not indicate whether the prior post-secondary studies were used for admission to a program at the receiving institution.

As admission records vary among the diverse institutions reporting on the following tables, strict comparability may be difficult.

Furthermore, the reported totals may not fully reflect mobility as some admissions categories may be incompletely reported; for example, part-time students at non-university public institutions, visiting students, unclassified students, and students who are enrolled at two institutions at the same time.

As Athabasca University offers continuous admission, students often proceed one course at a time through completion of their program and so the distinction between "full-time" and "part-time" may not be appropriate. AU distinguished between "full-time" and "part-time" in its reports for 1993-1996. Since then, AU's entry has been displayed as "part-time" although it includes an undetermined, though probably small, number of "full-time" students. Because of its continuous admission policy, the Fall 2006 admission cycle is defined as the number of new students admitted to Athabasca University between 1 January 2006 through 30 September 2006. Prior to 1999, AU's reporting period covered the five month period from 1 May through 30 September.
