Dear Colleague:

I am pleased to share with you the Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer's Transfer Patterns Report 2009 including the Extracts by Sector 1999-2009. For over three decades the Transfer Patterns study has examined the volume of student transfer between post-secondary institutions in Alberta, as well as students transferring into the province from other provinces and countries.

The 2009 Report includes Mobility Tables which reflect the number of students admitted for the first time to their post-secondary institution during the Fall 2009 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. The tables indicate the last post-secondary institution attended as the sending institution. The Mobility Tables do not attempt to indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience nor do they differentiate between University Transfer program students and those who have been granted transfer credit.

Highlights of the 2009 Transfer Patterns Study:

- A total of 11,713 students were admitted in September 2009 who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. This total is 1.5% higher than the previous year.
- A total of 5,832 students transferred into-province, which is an increase of 683 students or 13.3% from the previous year's total.
- Into-province transfers constitute 33.2% while transfers within the province constitute 66.8 % of the combined total of 17,545 students.

# INTRODUCTION

The mission of the Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer (ACAT) is to be a catalyst for beneficial change and an advocate for learners in the areas of admission and transfer throughout the post-secondary system. As a cornerstone of Campus Alberta, ACAT provides leadership and direction in the improvement of educational opportunities for Alberta students through inter-institutional transfer. ACAT is committed to supporting and improving communications among Alberta post-secondary institutions, while promoting the advantages of an expanding transfer system—these include increased opportunities for educational planning.

In the interest of advancing transfer opportunities in Alberta, ACAT presents the results of the 2009 Transfer Patterns Study, based on reports from 30 post-secondary ACAT member institutions.

ACAT has been collecting data from institutional Contact Persons since 1979, creating three decades of data about the mobility of post-secondary students in Alberta. The report includes mobility within the province, transfer from other Canadian provinces/territories, and from around the world.

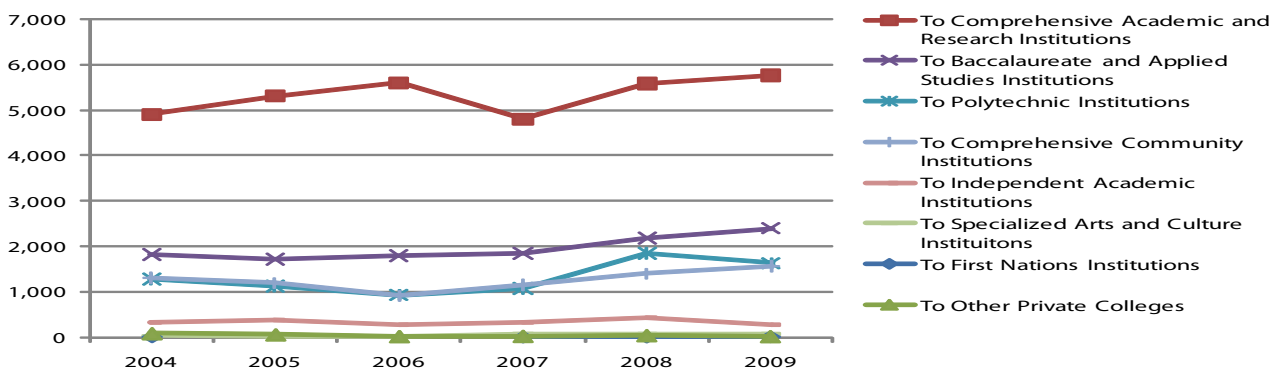
The attached Mobility Tables record the number of students admitted for the first time to their post-secondary institutions during the Fall 2009 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience. The tables show the last post-secondary institution attended as the “sending institution.” Institutions were asked to include students from all programs that are considered “undergraduate” programs at their institution. This would include students in many post-diploma and after-degree programs.

The Mobility Tables do not attempt to show whether or not the student received advanced credit for their previous experience, but rather are an overview of the mobility trends of students attending Alberta post-secondary institutions.

## Five Year Trends: 2004 to 2009

### Overall Transfer by Sector

This chart shows the types of institutions students have transferred to from other Alberta institutions and out-of-province institutions over the past five years.



*Note: Please be aware that the numbers provided by Athabasca University (AU) are attuned to its unique role, which allows students to begin a program of study any time during the year. As well, most Athabasca University students do not apply for transfer credit until they have already received 6 credits from AU, so students who have come from other institutions but have not yet received 6 credits from AU may not be represented in the report. As a result of these unique situations related to AU, there is a significant under-representation of the number of transfer students who are currently studying at AU.*

*The Alberta Council on Admissions and Transfer includes membership of 35 post-secondary institutions, including membership from both Aurora College and Nunavut Arctic College. The Alberta institution sectors, as outlined in the chart below, are referenced throughout the report.*

## Fall 2009 Within-Province Transfer Highlights

11,713 students were admitted to a post-secondary institution who had previously attended another Alberta post-secondary institution. This total represents a 1.5% increase from Fall 2008.

The overall ranking of sending and receiving institutions fluctuated slightly compared to 2008, with the most significant movement seen in the ranking of receiving institutions.

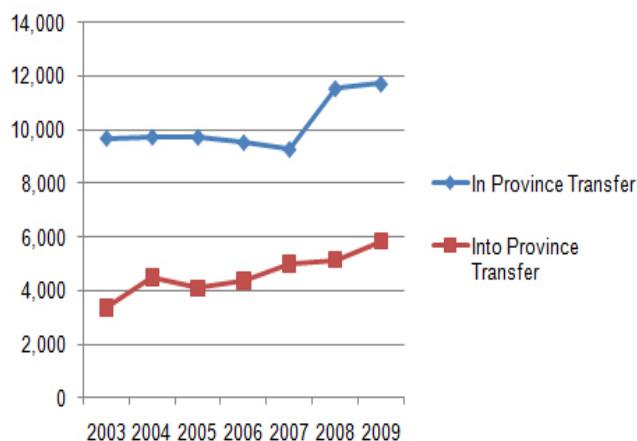

# INTO-PROVINCE HIGHLIGHTS

- Transfers into the province in Fall 2009 numbered **5,832** students (including students transferring from other countries), an increase of 683 students or **13.3%** over the previous year's total of 5,149 students. This year's numbers increased or remained consistent in all sectors except for Polytechnical and Independent Academic institutions, which were both slightly down.
- Into-Province transfers constituted **33.2%**, while In-Province transfers made up 66.8% of the total number of **17,545** students who transferred in 2009. In Fall 2008, into-province transfers constituted 35.1%, while transfers within the province made up 64.9% of the transfer students.
- In 1979, 2,993 students transferred into the province. Into-province transfers constituted 49.2% of the combined total in 1979.

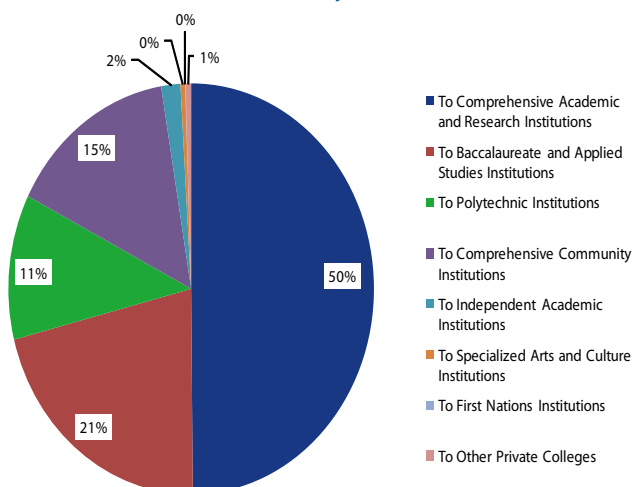
## In-Province vs. Into-Province Transfer

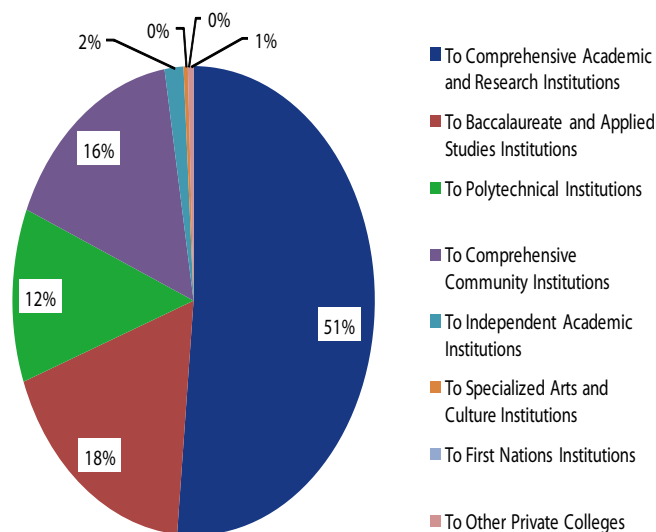

# INTERPROVINCIAL TRANSFERS

## Interprovincial Transfer - Highlights

- Interprovincial transfer increased **10.6%** from 2008, for a total of **4,345** students coming from institutions in other Canadian jurisdictions.
- The top five provinces for full-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2009 were Ontario, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia.
- The top five provinces for part-time student transfers into Alberta in Fall 2009 were Ontario, British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Nova Scotia.

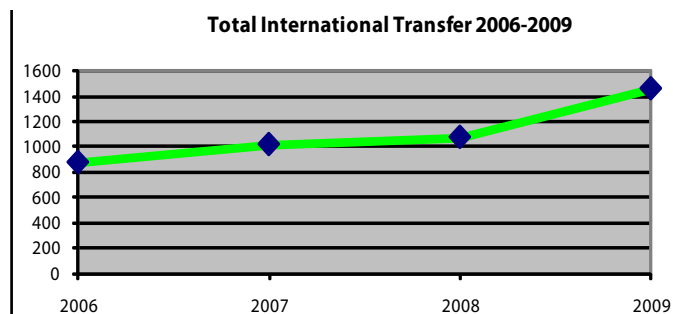
Alberta institutions received a total of **1,487** students from **80** different countries, representing a **14.5%** increase from Fall 2008. The top sending countries are listed in the following chart:

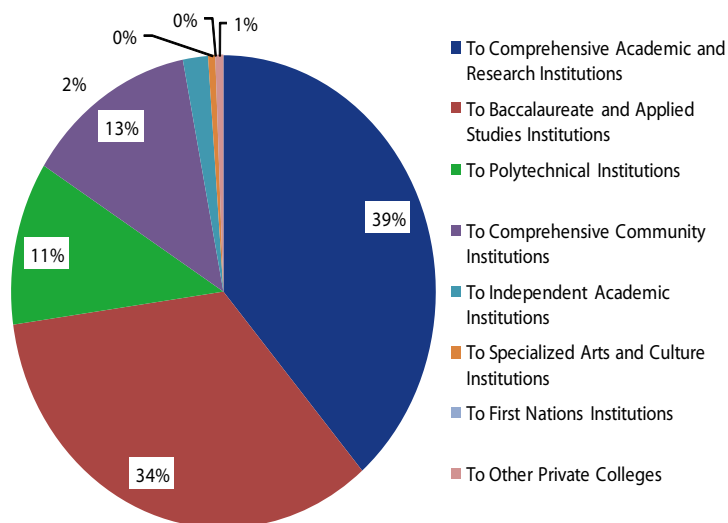

## Total International Transfer - 2006 to 2009

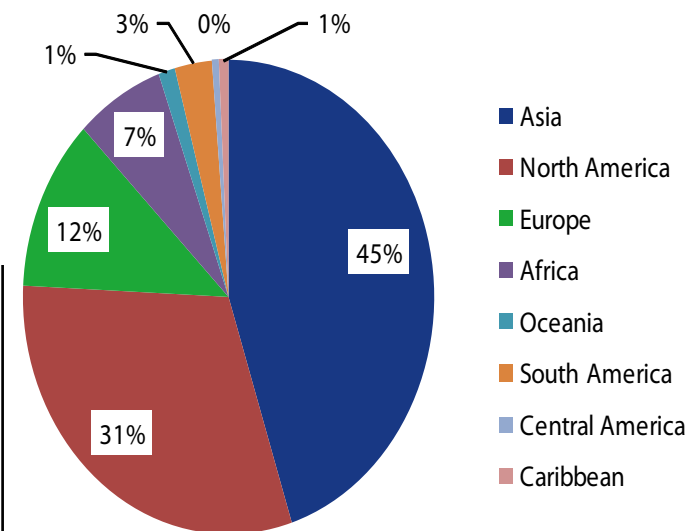
This chart shows the trend of students coming from institutions outside of Canada over the past four years.

# MOBILITY TABLES

Since 1979, ACAT has collected information annually from post-secondary institutions about the number of students with prior post-secondary experience who move to another post-secondary institution. Each post-secondary institution was asked to record the number of students admitted for the first time to their institutions during the Fall 2009 admission cycle who had reported prior post-secondary experience.

## NOTES:

- The data parameters have changed slightly for Fall 2009 to be more inclusive of students in all undergraduate programs, and to include students who may have left an institution and later returned to study there again. As a result, the following mobility numbers may be slightly higher than those prior to 2009.
- The data does not indicate whether these students received advance credit for their prior post-secondary experience.
- The data does not indicate if the post-secondary studies were used for admission to a program at the receiving institution.
- As admission records vary among the diverse institutions reporting on the following tables, strict comparability may be difficult.
- The reported totals may not fully reflect mobility as some admissions categories may be incompletely reported: for example, part-time students at non-university public institutions, visiting students, unclassified students, and students who are enrolled at two institutions at the same time.
- As Athabasca University offers continuous admission, students often take one course at a time so the distinction between “full-time” and “part-time” may not be appropriate. AU distinguished between “full-time” and “part-time” in its reports for 1993-1996. Since then, AU’s entry has been displayed as “part-time” although it includes an undetermined, though probably small, number of “full-time” students. Because of its continuous admission policy, the Fall 2009 admission cycle is defined as the number of new students admitted to Athabasca University between January 1, 2009 through September 30, 2009.

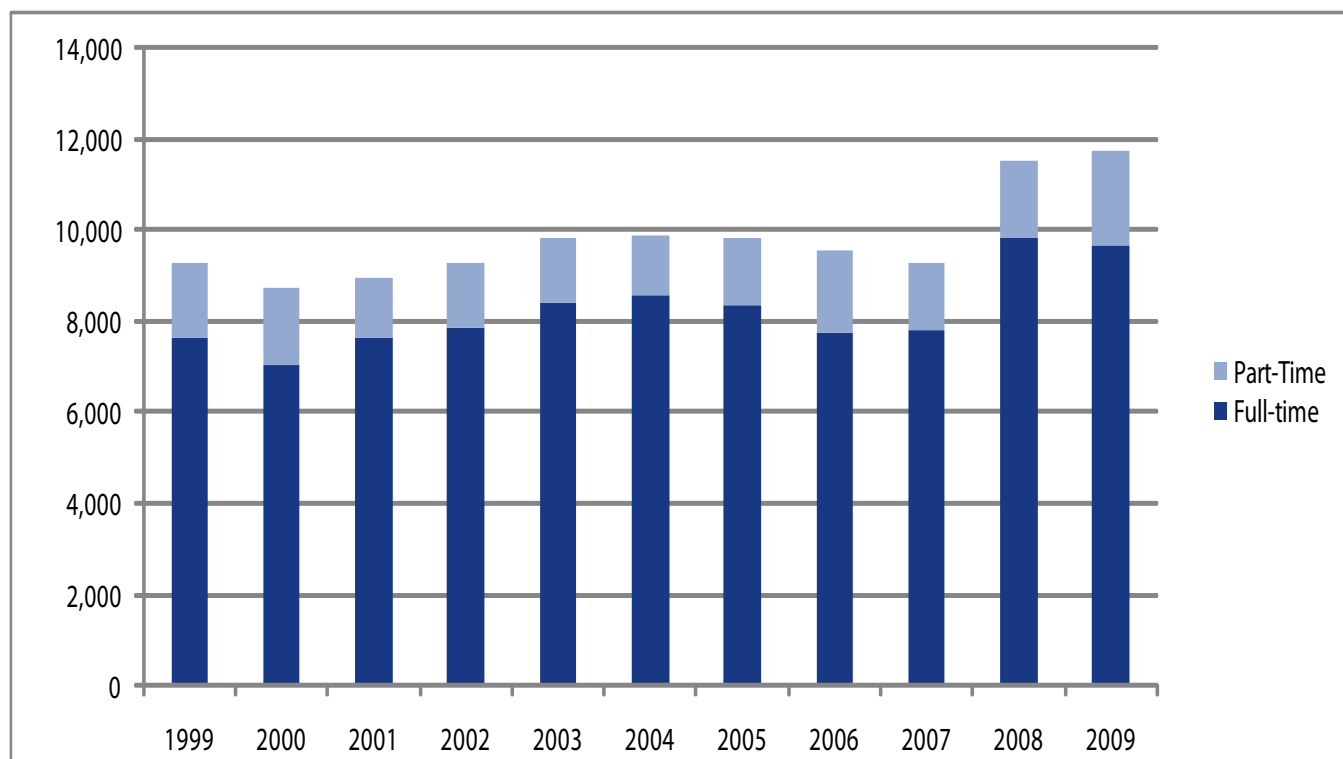

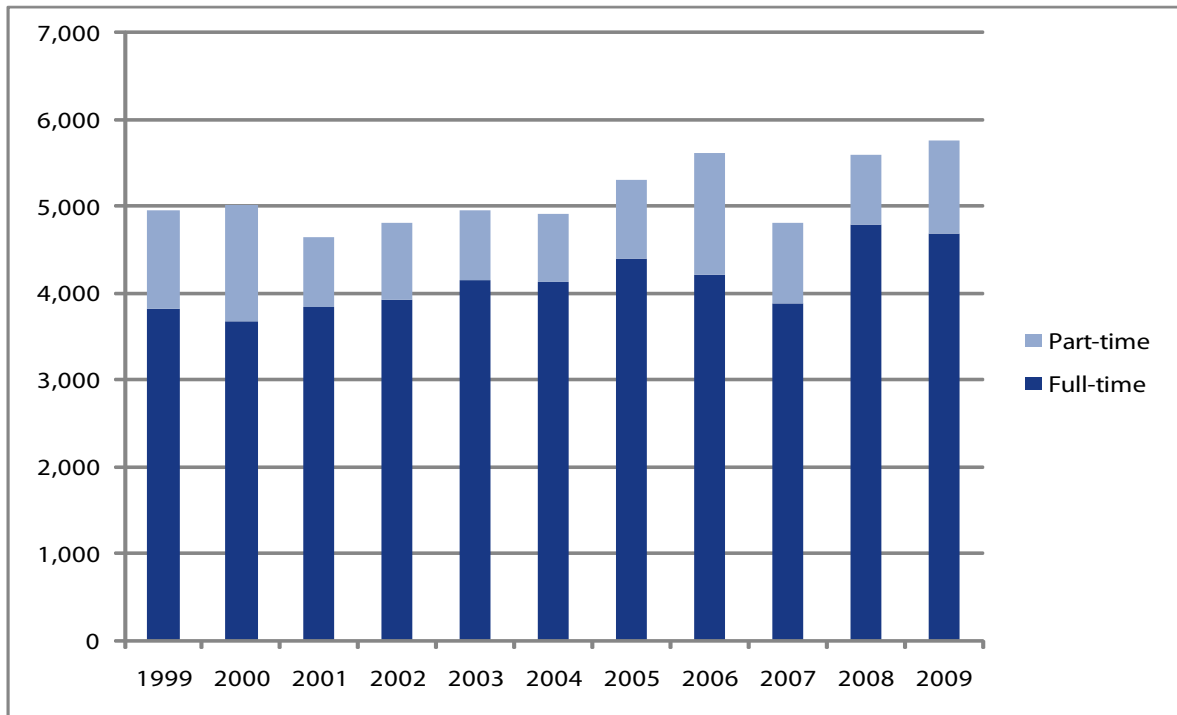
